RIA Beginnings and History

The Rochester International Association began as a registered nonprofit organization in 1982 as a merger of the Y International Center, the Rochester Refugee Resettlement Association and the Rochester World Festival. I was a part-time staff member of the International Center begun by Geri Critchley in 1980. SE Asian refugees were arriving in Rochester for resettlement in our community. Mayo Clinic patients, staff and their families were coming from all parts of the world to the Mayo Clinic. Rochester was a multicultural city. The RIA provided opportunities for multicultural communication, interaction and friendship in the community. Fuad Mansour, who had started the World Festival celebration joined the board and helped make this an annual event. We were assisted by Mayor Chuck Hazama who appointed the first International Affairs Committee for the city of Rochester.

The Refugee Resettlement committee was reorganized and became the Intercultural Mutual Assistance Association with Ron Buzzard as director of a staff of bilinguals from various SE Asian countries. The IMAA was first located in two houses on 7th Ave SW. Ron continues to lead this growing organization providing assistance for the many immigrants from various areas of the world who come to live in the Rochester area. When the RIA needed an office location, the IMAA arranged a space for RIA in one of the houses. Refugees from the war in Bosnia War began coming to Rochester seeking a safe home. When the IMAA moved to a larger building at 300 11th Ave. NW, they found office space for RIA in their building. Wars in Sudan and Somalia brought many Africans and their families to our community. Mexicans were also arriving as residents. Additional staff was needed so the IMAA made plans for a larger building to include private offices of their staff providing also for the various needs of their varied clients. The RIA appreciates the important work of the IMAA and thanks them for sharing their new space with our organization so we can continue to meet new people of all cultures that live in Rochester.

Since these early days, the RIA has offered friendship and communication with new internationals with annual events and

programs. Each of Rochester's mayors has continued to appoint and support members of the International Affairs Committee chaired for many years by Herta Matteson, former president of the RIA. We appreciate their continuing support and look forward in the upcoming year to:

- ★ the annual reception for new international residents and visitors hosted by Mayor Brede
- ★ Annual Thanksgiving Dinner hosted and prepared each year since by Fred Regal and his family
- ★ the annual Rochester World Festival held in April
- ★ the Rochesterfest parade entry
- ★ the International picnic at Silver Lake park with the Mayor's Committee

We welcome new members and wish more of you would take an active part. We thank our loyal continuing members who have sent their dues each year, served on the RIA Board, hosted and spoke at the monthly Y luncheon, taken part in organizing the annual World Festival each spring.
